Here are some tips for your next vacation that will help keep everyone in your family safe while you are all away.

Remember when not sure about the origins of your food, keep to the savvy traveller's motto: Wash it - Peel it - Cook it! Don't eat raw food or street food if you are not sure about the hygienic preparation of the meal.

For cold drinks, always order an unopened drink in a can and drink with a straw. Do not have cool drinks poured over ice cubes if you are not sure about the hygiene at the food outlet.

Take along swim shoes and do not step into shallow rock pools or onto rocks, plants or algae in the water, as sea urchins, stone fish or snakes might be hiding there. When hiking in the mountains, take proper hiking boots or sturdy shoes for shorter walks.

Wear sunscreen and possibly a hat, a top or trunks to protect your body from the sun. Avoid playing outdoors during the midday heat as the sun's UV rays will be strongest then. Better remain in the shade between 11 am and 3 pm. Re-apply your sunscreen regularly, especially after swimming and exercising.

Be careful when playing or swimming in the sea or in a lake or river. It's best to swim only in calm rivers, lagoons or protected ocean beaches and where lifeguards are present. Be aware of currents and tide times. Always ask the locals if a beach is safe or if there are any currents, should there be no lifeguard on duty. Never jump or dive into unknown waters as there might be items on the ground and/or the water might be not deep enough!

Avoid mosquito bites by wearing light-coloured long pants, long sleeved-shirts and protecting exposed skin with mosquito repellent spray or creams, and avoid being outside after dark.

Wash your hands often with soap and water or use a special alcohol-based hand sanitiser gel. If you have open wounds, clean them and apply antiseptic cream or ointment and cover with a plaster.

Take a travel health kit with you to always have some pain relief or medication, and for other common problems, such as plasters for blisters, **lozenges** for a sore throat, etc.

Mercury

The closest planet to the Sun is only about as wide as the Atlantic Ocean! 18 Mercuries would fit into the Earth. The planet does not have an atmosphere, just like it is on all the other planets. There is no water present on this dangerous planet either where temperatures vary between -180°C and 430°C/-290°F and 842°F. This is also the fastest planet. It speeds through space with 50 km per second/31 miles per second.

Venus

Venus is named after the Roman goddess of beauty. It has yellow clouds that cover the entire planet causing light to reflect off the surface. This makes Venus the second brightest object in the night sky after the Moon. However, only if the International Space Station is not in the sky! The space station looks like a very bright star!

Venus is very similar to Earth in terms of size and material. However, it is the hottest planet in the Solar System with temperatures reaching 460°C/480°F. The surface of Venus hosts thousands of volcanoes, craters and super-high mountain ranges. Many missions have been conducted about Venus, but many questions remain. The Soviet Union successfully landed eight spacecraft on Venus in the 70s and 80s, which cleared many mysteries.

Earth

Earth is the fifth largest planet of our Solar System and has one large natural satellite, the Moon. All planets were named after Roman and Greek gods and goddesses, except the Earth. The name nevertheless is more than 1,000 years old and means just 'ground'. Everything one ever knows is here. It's the only place where life is known to currently exist. Earth is 70% water.

Mars

Mars, the most likely candidate for a future human habitat, has huge storms that occur every now and then and cover the entire planet! Mars is very cold and dry, but water exists in the form of ice at the North and South poles. The surface of Mars has many **craters**, deep valleys and volcanoes. The craters are some of the deepest cave like systems ever seen. The largest peak on the Red Planet is a volcano called Olympus Mons, which is three times higher than Mount Everest, the highest mountain on Earth.
