

PURPOSE OF THE STUDENT'S HANDBOOK

To give the parents/guardians an understanding of the general rules and guidelines for attending and receiving education in our school. Students and parents/guardians should be aware that this document is reviewed annually since policy and procedure adoption is an ongoing process. The most recent adopted policy or procedure will always prevail. The handbook may be amended at any time and those changes will be communicated by the administration to the staff, students and parents/guardians. The following represents our expectations of all.

ON JOINING THE SCHOOL

INTRODUCTION

DPS Modern Indian School is under the aegis of DELHI PUBLIC SCHOOL SOCIETY, NEW DELHI. We follow C.B.S.E curriculum (INDIA).Our academic session is from APRIL to MARCH. July, August are summer holidays and December winter holidays.

We have classes from Nursery to XII. Admission is purely on merit which will be decided based on the performance of the child in the exams conducted in the previous school and the ADMISSION TEST conducted by us. Students should appear for admission test in English and Mathematics (Classes III - V); English, Mathematics and Science (Classes VI – XI).

Mid –*Term* admission will be done only if there is a vacancy. Syllabus will be according to term wise. Admission requests are entertained only against vacancy status.

In case a child wants to join our school in the middle of the academic year subject to availability of seat he / she should take the admission test in the topics covered in our school at that particular term.

- 2.) Copy of report card of last class attended from the previous school.
- b.) For Class IX to XII
- 1.) Migration certificate only if the student comes from other board / curriculum
- (Applicable for students taking admission to XI & XII).
- 2.) The parent has to submit a letter stating the reason for shifting to the new school in case of MID -

TERM Admission (XI to XII)

- 3.) CBSE Registration number / card in case of MID- TERM admission to class IX- XII.
- 4.) A copy of father's job Transfer Order or Offer Letter given to him by the company in Qatar has to be submitted.
- c.) For Class Nursery to Class V
- 1.) Self attested copy of birth certificate.

- 1.) Copy of Student's passport first & last page
- 2.) Copy of father's passport first & last page.
- 3.) Copy of mother's passport first & last page.

- 5.) Copy of father's Resident permit. (QID)
- 6.) Copy of mother's Resident permit. (QID)
- 7.) Copy of Health card / Health Insurance.
- 8.) Copy of blood group report of the student.
- 9.) Copy of Immunization card of the student.
- 10.) 3-Passport size photographs of the student.
- 11.) 1- Passport size photograph father and mother.

Note: If the blood group of the student is mentioned on the health card then ignore point no 8. Admission will be under Provisional category until the submission of complete documents in the list.

Please Note:

- The decision of the Principal / designate shall be final.
- Age Limit: The child should have completed 3.6 years (i.e. 3 years and 6 months) as on 1st of April for Nursery(KG-I) and 5 years and 6 months for class I.
- For Nursery & Prep child's preparedness for the specified grade is tested. In class I to V, a written test is conducted in English and Maths, VI to X written test is conducted in English, Maths and Science. All tests are followed by interaction with the Principal.

FEE PAYMENT METHOD

- DPS-MIS charges Transport Fee by term
- If a student has attended even a day of the academic session and wishes to withdraw transport fee for that term, there will be no refund of fee paid for that term.
- Transport fees will not be adjusted in case of change in location (zone) till the end of the term.

- Caution deposit payable 'Per Student' registered in the school
- Fee must be paid in full at the beginning of each school term.

1. Non-Payment of fees:-

Students with unpaid dues will be requested to leave the school without a transfer certificate. Issuing a transfer certificate will be only considered after all the dues are settled. Re-admission will be considered only after payment of full fees (current outstanding and for the next academic year) in advance.

2. Re-Admission fee:-

a. Re-admission fees of QAR 300/- along with the late fee will have to be paid, in case the student is a fee defaulter and his/her name has been struck off from the rolls.

b. Re-admission fee (inclusive of caution deposit, tuition fee and re-admission of QAR.300/-will have to be paid if a child applies for re-admission after obtaining the transfer certificate in the same academic year.

3. Withdrawal & Refund of fees:-

a. For withdrawal of a student from the school, one clear calendar months' notice in writing

or a Term's Fees (i.e. transportation and tuition fees, special fees for the relevant term) in lieu of such a notice must be given. Fees (for that particular term), special fees, admission fees, bus fees and tuition fees will not be refunded at all.

b. If a child, who is newly admitted into the school, is withdrawn before the beginning of session, only the admission fee will be forfeited from the fees deposited.

c. If a student has attended even a day of the academic session and wishes to withdraw,

then the special fee, admission fee, tuition fee as well as the transportation fee for that

term will not be refunded.

e. Tuition fee, Bus fees and Special fees for a particular term have to be paid even if the child remains absent in the term.

4. Rules for direct invoicing to corporate companies:-

a. In case of new admissions, if the fee is to be borne by the Company with whom the parent is working with, the required Corporate information is to be stated in the admission form at the time of taking admission and an official letter from the student's parent Company should be submitted to Accounts Department, one month prior to the start of the next term.

b. In case, if, existing admissions falling under either "General or Local Staff Ward Category" opt for a change to "Corporate Category", the required letter from the student's parent Company should be submitted to Accounts Department, one month prior to the start of the next term.

c.The Corporate letters received after the generation of the fee for the term in progress shall be taken into account only from the next term and hence the fee generated under "General Category" will have to be paid by the parent at the School Fee Counter or any other mode of payment prescribed in point (III) above.

d. It is the responsibility of the parent to obtain the letter from their work place and submit to the school one month prior to the start of the next academic term. The school will not be liable to send any supplement Fee invoices to the corporate company.

NOTE:

- 1. White canvas shoes (for PT / Games periods)
- 2. Parents are expected to ensure that their wards are in proper uniform.
- 3. Boys must have a short haircut, girls hair should be neatly tied back with a black hair band.

SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Bus routes and assignments of students to stops are made by the transport supervisor in accordance with school guidelines and are reviewed annually and subject to change. During the first several weeks of school, routes and times are often adjusted to assure timely arrival at school. Students will be picked up and dropped only at designated stops.
- Any request for change should be intimated one month in advance. Parental requests to change the location of a bus stop are reviewed by the Transport Executive and transport supervisor. The transport supervisor will inform the parent making the request of any approved changes.
- Transport fees will be collected in advance for the full term. In case of discontinuation of school transport, the fees will not be refunded. Parents need to pay the transport fees even though child is absent for a long period or a term.
- **4** Bus stop allocation is at the discretion of the school administration.
- The bus driver does not have the authority to change stops. If you have questions about school bus transportation, contact Transport Executive.
- Regular buses do not pick up or drop off students availing private transport.
- Requests for transportation in an alternate bus or from a different stop will only be considered if the request is permanent in nature the same pick up and/or drop off point each day. All requests must be in writing and are subject to the approval of the school administration based upon available space on the route requested. Requests will take 5-10 school days to become effective.
- Parents or guardians are responsible for the safety of their child on the way to and from as well as at the bus stop.
- Children should arrive at bus stops approximately 5 minutes prior to the scheduled pick-up time. Bus will not wait for any student if child is not at the bus stop at the assigned time.
- Parents who meet the school bus should wait on the side of the street where the bus stops. Otherwise, children are tempted to rush across the street regardless of traffic.
- Kindergarten children will not be dropped off without a responsible adult to meet them.
- They will be returned to their school to await parents.
- 4 Indiscipline in school bus will be strictly dealt and may result in the discontinuation of bus facility.
- If the Discontinuance Request is submitted during the term in progress, fee will not be refunded. Full term fees will be charged.
- 4 All buses will leave school premises at 1:55 pm. Bus drivers will not wait for students, if students miss the bus.
- All parents are requested to save driver's telephone numbers.
- No parents are permitted to pick students from the buses at school parking area without gate pass.
- There are four zones for bus routes with different fee structure and no fees will be refunded due to change of address or change of pick up and drop off point.

For any updates on transport kindly check school web site.

Note: Parents are not permitted to collect their ward after 10:00 AM (Nursery Students) and after 1:00 PM (Students of class I to XII). This is to help our students to have a smooth dispersal.

Stay Back Facility for Nursery and Preparatory:-

Fees of QR 200 will be charged for availing the stay back facility at school after

11.00AM. Fees will be taken in advance for the full term. In case of discontinuation of stay back facility, fees already collected will not be reimbursed. Kindly inform in advance for the next term in case of discontinuity. Authorization letter is required in case the child is to be picked up by anybody other than the parent. Parents to keep class teacher informed in case of any change in the drop off point. Stay back children should be given an extra lunch box and water bottle.

WITHDRAWALS

- 1. One clear calendar months' notice in writing or a term fees (i.e. transportation and tuition fees for the relevant term) in lieu of such a notice must be given. In no case tuition fees (for that particular month), special fees, and admission fees will be refunded.
- 2. If a child, who is newly admitted into the school is withdrawn before the beginning of the academic session, only the admission fees will be forfeited from the fees deposited.
- 3. Special fee, admission fee, tuition fee and transportation fee for the month will not be refunded to a student who has attended even a day of an academic session but wishes to withdraw in between the session.
- 4. Transfer certificate will not be issued until all dues of the school are settled.
- 5. If the Transfer Certificate is lost or misplaced, new certificate will be issued on payment of QRS. 50/-
- 6. Students can be asked to leave the school on the following grounds:
- a) Disciplinary ground
- b) Unsatisfactory progress in academics
- C) Detention or repeated detentions in class.

However, the student must also secure 81 % in the 3rd language (for classes V-VIII) to be eligible for scholar badge.
- In classes X & XII, Scholar Badge will be awarded to those students who secure 91 % in a minimum of four academic subjects and 81 % in the fifth.
- Scholar badge will be awarded to the students of class XI provided they have secured a minimum of 85 % in aggregate and a minimum of 85 % in all the subjects.
- The student must have minimum of 80 % attendance in the class.
- o The student must have taken all Terminal Examinations and Weekly Tests.
- o The student should not have received punishment for breaking any school rules listed in the Almanac.



ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASS XI -SCIENCE STREAM

To be eligible for the Science stream in class XI, students should obtain a minimum of 75% in Science and Mathematics separately (if opting for Mathematics). The Students passing from a State Board will be required to obtain 80% in the aggregate as well as in Science and Mathematics separately.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASS XL -COMMERCE STREAM I HUMANITIES

To be eligible for the Commerce stream / Humanities in Class XI, students should obtain a minimum 50% in all subjects and 75% in Standard Mathematics (if opting for Mathematics in Commerce Stream)

The Students passing from a State Board will be required to obtain 70% in the aggregate 75% in Mathematics (if opting for Mathematics).

STUDENTS APPOINTMENTS AT LEADERSHIP ROLES

Social leadership and responsibility are best learnt through active participation. Selected after a careful scrutiny of their school records, a number of student appointments are entrusted with various responsibilities and share the task of maintaining decorum in the school. Senior student appointments meet the Principal and Head Mistress periodically.

2. PRESIDENT SCHOOL ACTIVITIES



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A GOOD STUDENT FOLLOWS SCHOOL RULES

GENERAL RULES

- A student must carry his / her almanac to school every day. A student should affix his/her photograph and fill in the required information, duly signed by a parent, in the space provided for in the almanac.
- Students who come to school on their own should reach the school before School timings.
- Students are not allowed to bring mobile phone to school. If they do so, it will be confiscated.
- Changing of classrooms between periods should be done in an orderly manner and silently. Students should not unnecessarily leave their class at the end of every period.
- Students should be habitually clean and always neatly dressed. The school uniform should be worn on all working days and for all school functions. Students who are slovenly dressed or not in uniform will be sent home. Use of hair gel & wearing low waist trousers are discouraged.
- Lending or borrowing of money or other articles is not allowed.
- Students who come to school escorted should never leave before the escort arrives. In case of delay, they
 should report to the school office.
- Students are not allowed to use the school telephone without the permission of the Receptionist. They will not be called to answer phone calls during class hours.
- Office Bearers will wear their respective badges daily.
- Students using the school bus will maintain discipline in the bus.
 - The school insists on the following measures to be observed by the members of staff and all students. Care must be taken to observe the "green rules" in order to maintain clean, green surroundings. If polythene bags are brought to school, care should be taken to dispose them off in the right bin. Minimal use of polythene bags will be appreciated.
- It is not advisable to bring valuable articles (like expensive watches or fountain pens) to school. If lost, the school is not responsible for it.
- All the students must wear the school I.D card provided by the school while boarding the school bus, failing which they will have to pay a fine of Q.R 10/-
- Vaccination record must be provided at the start of the year if the child is not completely immunized.
- Canteen facility is available only at break time or after the school hours. If there is an emergency, children can avail this facility with the permission slip from the teacher concerned. (Currently this facility is not available due to the COVID 19 protocol)

LATE ARRIVALS:

- The school gate will close at 7:10 am.
- A note will be made in the almanac if any student reaches late to school.
- Three consecutive late arrivals would lead to the student being sent home.

UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE:

- Students should come neatly dressed to the school.
- Girls should plait their hair if the hair length is below their shoulders and they should not wear any jewellery to the school. However they can wear a pair of small earrings.
- Boys should get their hair cut at regular intervals.
- There should be a name tag on blazers and sweaters.

LIBRARY RULES



Books other than reference books are issued for a week. Reference books are also issued to the students during weekend for two days. If the library books are returned late without a valid reason, the borrowing facility will be withdrawn for two weeks.

Books marked, disfigured or damaged will have to be replaced or paid for by the borrower.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GUARDIANS

- Check your ward's almanac daily. Do sign the remarks if any and take necessary action.
- Report cards (Nursery and Preparatory) should be signed and returned to the class teachers. If lost, a duplicate report card will be issued on payment of a fine of QR.50.
- For classes I XII, parents should regularly check their ward's report on the website.
- Prior permission needs to be taken if you wish to take your ward away during the school hours.

Fix up a prior appointment in case you need to meet your ward's teachers. In no case, the teachers should be disturbed during their classes. Hence it is advisable that a note be written in your ward's almanac asking the teacher concerned for a meeting or school office is called up to fix an appointment.



No class party (in case of birthdays) can be held during the school hours. No gifts I pastries I cakes I pizzas etc. should be sent to school for distribution among the students.

Train your ward to (especially for the junior school students) show the remarks / requests made by you in the almanac to the teacher concerned.

ABSENCE

1. Students who have been sick should bring a medical certificate from their doctor on the day of joining the school.

2. Parents should fill up the "Record for Non-Attendance" for each day the student is absent from school, stating the reasons for absence.

3. Students, who require medical attention during school hours, may bring it to the knowledge of the Class Teacher.

4. No one who has been absent on the previous day will be admitted to the class without a letter from the parent addressed to the Class Teacher, stating the reason for the absence.

5. Leave for going out of town should be approved of prior to proceeding on leave

6. Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to class:

a. Chicken pox –Till complete falling of the scabs.

- b. Cholera -Till the child is completely well.
- c. Measles -Two weeks after the rash disappears
- d. Mumps -Until the swelling has gone, about one month.
- e. Jaundice Six weeks after recovery.

7. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than six consecutive days renders the student liable to have his / her name struck off the rolls. Re-admission may be granted only on payment of a fresh admission fee.

8. It is compulsory for the students to complete 80% of the attendance in the academic session to make them eligible to sit for the final examination.

9. Request for any duplicate document will be issued on payment of QAR 50/-

10. COVID-19. Follow the guidelines given by the Ministry of Public Health.

Make sure there is no response to rude or harassing emails.

(Keep a record in case of further investigation)

- Immediately exit any site that makes you feel uncomfortable or worried.
- If harassment continues. ...your current email account can be deleted and a new one started.
 Your new email address should only be given to a selected few.
- If receiving harassing messages on MSN have the sender blocked.
- PC's SHOULD be in a common area of the house NOT IN THE BEDROOM!
- Your parents should walk past regularly.
- Do not have a 'suggestive' or 'flirty' log on name.
- NEVER allow explicit photos of yourself to be taken in ANY circumstance
- If you have found inappropriate content about yourself on a website or are informed about this situation please tell your parents.
- Help your parents to learn about the internet share your knowledge of the internet with your parents in a fun environment. If they have some knowledge they will be less likely to be suspicious about 'socializing online ,
- Let your parents know where you go online, just as you would in real life.
- Ask your parents to spend time online with you learn and explore together.
- Make sure your computer has a good filter and other monitoring/blocking software to minimize dangers.
- Make sure you are on safe and suitable sites. Filters CAN sometimes fail to protect.

- There should be house rules about what information you can put onto websites or share with others.
- Remember that the internet is PERMANENT. Be mindful of what you post and how you portray yourself. Pics etc can remain FOREVER 2
- Teach your parents the language of the cyberspace.
- ABSOLUTELY NO EXCHANGE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION!
- Social Networking profiles such as Facebook etc SHOULD BE SET TO PRIVATE.
- MSN contacts and social networking site friends should be people that you know in real life. This is one way to reduce possible risks.
- An 'online friend' that you don't know in real life is a STRANGER.
- Passwords MUST NOT BE SHARED!!!!! Choose passwords that others can't guess, not your fav food or pets name. Should be a mix of caps/letters/numbers/symbols.
- Change passwords 4 times per year (last day of every term)
- Be aware that information on the internet is not always reliable.
- Very close supervision for young children is recommended. There should be a limit to the email correspondence list to be a list of friends and family that has been approved. If you are playing games online, YOUR parents should know how to play the game too in case of problems. Play online games together.
- Misuse of the internet and associated technology (bullying/harassing someone) is a crime. Don't break the law and risk getting a criminal record.
- Learn how search engines work. The first website returned may not be the best.
 - The internet and the various applications are a lot of fun and a wonderful tool. Maximize the benefits and surf safely together!
