Students must pass in Theory as well as in Practical separately, for promotion to Class XII.

The Weekly Test marks will be continuously updated after every cycle for V-XII and can be viewed online on the website.

PROMOTION CRITERIA

- Students scoring 33% and above for classes V-IX in aggregate will qualify for promotion to the next class.
- Students scoring 33% and above for classes XI in all subjects and aggregate will qualify for promotion to the class XII (Please note the student should score 33% marks in theory as well as in practicals).
- Attendance for Weekly Tests and all the main exams for all classes are compulsory.
- Grades will also be given in the following areas of learning: Computers, Work Experience, Physical/Moral Education, Dance, Music, Art and other activities (whenever applicable).
- Students found using unfair means during Weekly Test or Term Exam will be marked Zero in that subject. No retest will be held for such students. These students will not be eligible for any academic award or school appointments.

ACADEMIC & OTHER AWARDS FOR CLASSES V-XII SCHOLAR BADGE:

- I. Scholar Badge is awarded to the students of classes V-VIII provided they have secured 91% in a minimum of any four main subjects (English, 2nd Language, Mathematics, Science and Social Science) and 81% in the 5th main subject in the final results. However the student must also secure 81% in the 3rd language to be eligible for scholar badge.
- II. In classes IX, X & XII, Scholar Badge will be awarded to those students who secure 90% in a minimum of four academic subjects and 80% in the fifth.
- III. Scholar badge will be awarded to the students of class XI provided they have secured a minimum of 85% in aggregate and a minimum of 85% in all the subjects.

Note:-

- I. The student must have minimum of 80% attendance in the class.
- II. The student must have taken all Terminal Examinations and Weekly Tests.
- III. The student should not have received punishment for breaking any school rules listed in the Almanac.

BLUE BLAZER:

Blue School Blazers are awarded to students receiving Scholar Badges for three consecutive years.

BLUE TIE:

Blue Tie is awarded to the students for being declared scholars for four consecutive years.

GOLD MEDAL:

Gold Medal is awarded to the students who have been scholars for five consecutive years.

SILVER MEDAL:

Silver Medal is awarded to the students who have been scholars for five years with oneyear gap.

SPECIAL AWARDS:

Students receiving Scholar Badge for six consecutive years and above will be given a special award.

PROFICIENCY AWARDS (V-IX):

Proficiency Awards will be given to those students securing above 90% marks in all subjects including 3rd language.

Newly admitted students who have not taken all weekly tests and examinations will not be eligible for scholar badge.

AWARDS (For classes X-XII)

- Subject toppers in class X Board Examination.
- Students holding 1st position in each stream.
- Students securing the highest marks in the class XI in each subject, formally tested, provided S/ he has appeared in all the weekly tests and exams.
- Topper in X Boards
- Topper in XII Boards (In Science, Commerce and Humanities separately)
- Students receiving the highest marks in a subject in XII Board Examination.
- Students getting 100% marks in any subject in XII Board Examination.
- It is compulsory that the student must have appeared for all the weekly tests and Terminal Examinations for being eligible for any academic award.

SPECIAL AWADRS:

- Students with 100% attendance in all sections (From Nur-XII)
- The best All Rounder in each grade (V-XII) [Students to be selected on the basis of Academics, Co-Curricular, Literary and Social Awareness, Games, Sports and Personality Traits by a committee of teachers]

NOTE: Newly admitted students who have not taken all weekly tests and exams will not be eligible for scholar badge.
